Breg provides DME, durable medical equipment, to over 1 million patients annually. As Breg worked with providers to streamline the process of procuring equipment for patients, they quickly began to encounter integration roadblocks as they began working with multiple EHR vendors. The Breg application team wasn't structured to account for the amount of development changes needed with each new EHR vendor limiting their ability to complete concurrent projects in the volume needed. Shari Matkin, Breg's Senior Manager of Customer Experience, will talk about the moment Breg realized they had a strategy that couldn't scale and how they've leveraged Redox as the solution to this problem.

# Doing a Lot with a Small Team: Accelerating Digital Innovation at a Large Academic Medical Center
