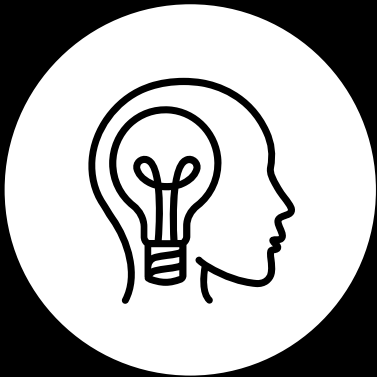


# AI adoption strategies for providers

Evangelize a holistic definition of AI so everyone works with a shared understanding—and no one confuses it with automation software.

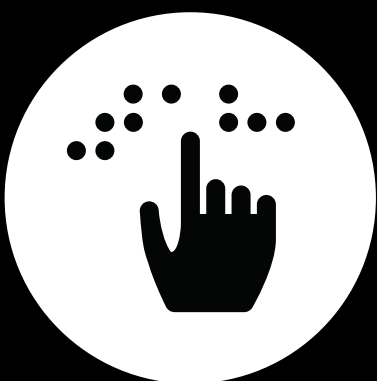
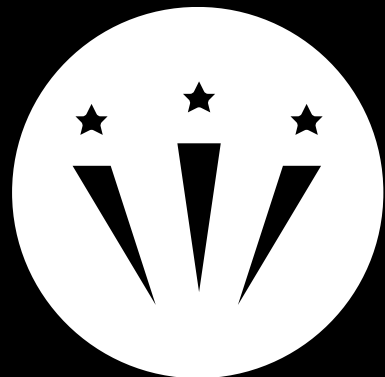


## Set up critical services

Avoid waiting to finalize the perfect plan before kicking off your AI initiative. Start small and begin charting your progress now.

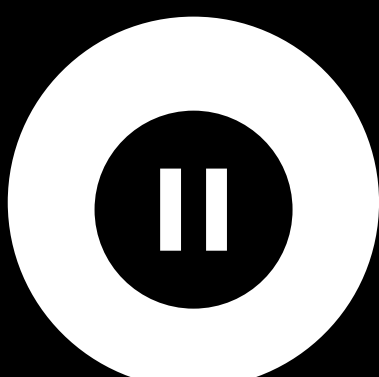


## Favor hands-on learning
